WHEREAS, Italian-Americans form an integral part of this Commonwealth's diverse community and have made notable contributions to the social, cultural and economic well being of our state and the nation; and,

WHEREAS, this year marks the 500th anniversary of the naming of America after Amerigo Vespucci who distinguished himself as a navigator and cosmographer; and,

WHEREAS, this year marks the 300th anniversary of the birth of Carlo Goldoni, the acclaimed Venetian playwright who works captured the values and struggles of ordinary working people; and,

Italian film director Lina Wertmüller achieved international fame (and an Oscar) during the 1970s for her always controversial comedies that lambasted social mores, political structures, religion and family in Italy. Justly or unjustly, she was lionized for her visual and conceptual originality by some critics, and reviled for her alleged misogyny and barely disguised racism by others. The polarized nature of the criticism is proof of the fascination and complexity of her films.
